# 2084 and the AI Revolution by John Lennox. Zondervan 384 pages

Zondervan have published an 'updated and expanded edition' of John Lennox's book '2084 and the AI revolution'. Sub-titled 'How artificial intelligence informs our future', it comes with strong endorsements in information technology and computing from distinguished senior academics at both Oxford and Cambridge Universities.

The book has 4 parts - Mapping Out the Territory; Two Big Questions; The Now and Future of AI; and Being Human, together with a Scripture index, a General Index and 38 pages of Notes. Its 359 pages include Questions. So this is a book to study, to challenge and provoke our thinking about - to quote the dust cover - 'Emerging Technology and the Future of Humanity'.

This book is weighty in every sense. A big book and good book to read and discuss with other thinking people in a small group who are prepared to think hard and 'stay with it' for a sustained period - months rather than weeks.
